Neil Taylor is a sought after and renowned choral director, organist, piano accompanist, teacher and coach, based in the North West of England. After winning a Scholarship to the Royal College of Music, he held appointments at St Albans and Norwich Cathedrals, and was Organist and Director of Music at Sheffield Cathedral from 1997 to 2016. during which time the cathedral choir toured both at home and abroad and broadcast frequently on BBC Radios 2 and 3. His CD Recordings include Music for a Millennium, a Classic FM Magazine CD of the Year Award Winner, and nine critically-acclaimed CD recordings with the cathedral choir. As solo organist, he has played at many major UK venues, and has worked with the Hallé, Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra, Royal Northern Sinfonia and Welsh National Opera Orchestra. He is Musical Director of St George's Singers, The Sheffield Chorale, and Artistic Director of the Keele Bach Choir; he appears frequently with the BBC as Musical Director and Organist on BBC Daily Service and Sunday Worship.

Robert Brooks is a baritone, conductor and composer based in Manchester. He directs the Edinburgh University Chamber Choir, the Preston Cecilian Choral Society and the Manchester Singers and is a member of the National Youth Choir Fellowship - an octet of exceptional young singers selected to form a flagship ensemble for the National Youth Choirs of Great Britain. Robert was a treble in the choir of New College, Oxford, under Edward Higginbottom. He completed a music degree at Manchester University, where he directed the chamber choir Ad Solem and was given an award by the university for services to choral conducting. During this time he also sang in the third Genesis Sixteen choral programme. After graduating, Robert directed the Leeds College of Music Choral Society and the Oratory Choir of St Chad's, and sings with Patchwork Opera and the Turton Consort.

Pete Durrant is the accompanist of Keele Bach Choir, Stafford Choral Society and St George's Singers and is the conductor of Leek Choral Society. Pete was a chorister at Westminster Abbey, singing at many high-profile events, including the funeral of Princess Diana. He studied music at The University of Manchester, receiving the Proctor Gregg prize for performance, and in 2010 he completed a Masters in Piano Performance at the RNCM. Pete now works at the RNCM and University of Manchester as an accompanist and is in demand as a piano, vocal and theory teacher. Pete has accompanied Manchester University Chorus, the BBCSO Chorus, the Hallé, Hallé Youth and Hallé Children's Choirs under Sir Mark Elder, and has conducted The University of Manchester's chamber choir Ad Solem and Keele Bach Choir.

St George's Singers A passion for singing

St George's Singers is widely recognised as one of the most enterprising, innovative and versatile choirs in the North of England, with a genuine passion for singing. The Choir was formed in Poynton, Cheshire in 1956 with 23 founding members drawn from the local community. Today, it has over 100 members who travel from Cheshire, Derbyshire, Yorkshire and Greater Manchester.

Under Musical Director Neil Taylor, the Choir performs an extensive and eclectic repertoire that covers renaissance, baroque, classical, jazz, modern and newly commissioned choral works. We put on four major concerts a year, hold an annual open Singing Day, are frequently invited to take part in collaborative ventures with other choirs and orchestras, particularly Chetham's School of Music. Concert venues in Manchester include the Bridgewater Hall, Stoller Hall, Gorton Monastery, Manchester Cathedral and the Royal Northern College of Music, but we also perform in our 'home' churches of St George's Stockport and St George's Poynton. We sing with world-class soloists and orchestras, and tour regularly in the UK and overseas.

Although a large choir, St George's Singers is also an extremely friendly and welcoming group. Entry to the Choir is by audition, and new members can join at any time. We rehearse on Tuesday evenings in St George's Church Hall, Poynton, SK12 1AF and we recommend you come along to a few rehearsals before auditioning.

For our first concert in Manchester's exciting new concert venue, the magnificent Stoller Hall, we are performing Rachmaninov's Vespers, as part of Chetham's month-long series of arts and music events to mark the Russian Revolution. Written in just two weeks early in 1915, the Vespers (also called the All-Night Vigil) was enthusiastically received by the public on its premiere, but proved to be Rachmaninov's last sacred piece: within two years, religion was banned and the composer forced into exile. The Stoller Hall offers the perfect acoustics for this crowning achievement of the 'Golden Age' of Russian church music.

Haydn's interest in choral music had been aroused during his first London visit, when he had attended one of the Handel Commemoration concerts in Westminster Abbey. The experience, which had moved him deeply, inspired him to compose two oratorios in the English rather than the Italian manner: giving an important role to the choir rather than basing the work on the aria. *The Creation*, completed in 1798, is full of grand choruses, sometimes hymn-like and simple, sometimes with elaborate parts for solo voices, but always a delight to sing and listen to.

Whether you decide to join St George's Singers for a wonderful day's singing, or just come to the performance in the evening, you are sure to be entertained and enlightened.

To mark the season of Lent, we present a selection of music composed for Passiontide, from late Renaissance masterpieces to works by renowned contemporary composers. The centrepiece of the concert is Stainer's *Crucifixion* – a work last performed by St George's Singers 60 years ago in 1957. Enormously popular in its day, but infrequently performed nowadays, the *Crucifixion* is a fine example of mid-Victorian church music, written as a more approachable alternative to Bach's Passions.

Duruflé Requiem

Maurice Duruflé's *Requiem* is modelled on that of his French compatriot, Gabriel Fauré, in that it sets the identical text, and creates a similarly subdued, ethereal atmosphere. But Duruflé's *Requiem* stands on its own as a spellbinding fusion of plainsong themes from the Mass for the Dead with choral polyphony and orchestration. The *Messa da Requiem* of the Italian Ildebrando Pizzetti employs neo-Renaissance techniques to the text of the Requiem Mass, and exemplifies the transition in Italian sacred music from the 19th to the early 20th century. The concert also features the premiere of *War's Embers*, a work commissioned by St George's Singers as part of the 'Whittingham Asylum Project'. (For more information on this project, see p 10.)

Whittingham Asylum Project

The Whittingham Asylum Project, 'Whittingham Lives', is a two-year arts and heritage project, supported by the Heritage Lottery, to explore the culture and legacy of Whittingham Asylum in Preston, from the 1850s to its demolition in 2016. Music played an enormous part in the lives of patients and staff at Whittingham, and as part of this important North West heritage project, St George's Singers has commissioned a choral piece on the theme of madness. Composed by Sasha Johnson Manning, War's Embers sets to music the words of Ivor Gurney, musician and First World War poet, who suffered from mental illness for many years before his death in 1937.

The most recent, The Christmas Life, was selected for broadcast by Classic FM, and features traditional and modern carols, including special commissions by St George's Singers. 
