Dear Friends

Fingers crossed, of course, but things do seem to be getting back to normal after the Covid-19 lockdown. Last season we tempted audiences back from lockdown with blockbuster concert programmes – including Bach's *St John Passion* and Walton's *Belshazzar's Feast* – and you responded enthusiastically. Our 2022–23 season's programme is no less exciting and no less tempting! As I'm sure you know, this year is the 150th anniversary of Ralph Vaughan Williams' birth. In November we celebrate this event with a concert devoted to his work, featuring the well-loved work *The Lark Ascending* in a remarkable and beautiful arrangement by Paul Drayton for choir and solo violin. Definitely not to be missed!

In 2021 our *Christmas Carols by Candlelight* was limited by Covid restrictions, but this year we are back to normal festivities, with the return of our guest children's choir *and* mulled wine and mince pies. What better way to get into the seasonal spirit! And after Christmas, if you are a singer, you can recover from Christmas indulgence by joining us at our annual Singing Day, singing all the great coronation anthems.

Returning to our concert series, in March we bring you the delightful *Petite Messe Solennelle* by Rossini, a great favourite of singers and audiences everywhere. As this brochure notes elsewhere, this operatic 'Mass' is neither small nor solemn, but full of contrast, drama and memorable tunes – a musical treat. We end the season in June with a bang! Duke Ellington's *Sacred Concert* gives us a chance to show the Choir's versatility, singing his joyous jazz rhythms alongside the big band sound of the Cotton Tail Orchestra and the smouldering voice of soloist Louise Marshall.

2022–23 is yet another season of contrasts and drama from St George's Singers. I hope to see you in the audience!

2022 is the 150th anniversary of the birth of one of Britain's greatest composers, Ralph Vaughan Williams. Our opening concert of this season is a celebration of his music and will feature some of his best-loved choral works, including a thrilling new version of *The Lark Ascending* by Paul Drayton for solo violin and choir, the *Te Deum in G* written for the enthronement of the Archbishop of Canterbury in 1928, and his *Mass in G minor*, which marries the sound worlds of Tallis and Byrd with modern idioms to produce a quintessentially English work.

Singing Day Coronation Anthems

To celebrate the 70th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth II's coronation, our 2023 Singing Day features some of Britain's best-loved 'royal' anthems. In addition to Handel's *Zadok and Let thy hand be strengthened*, we'll be singing anthems by Wesley (*Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace*) and Stanford (*Gloria in excelsis*). The line-up is completed by Parry's *I was glad*, originally written for the coronation of Edward VII, then revised for George V, and Walton's spectacular *Coronation Te Deum*, composed for the Queen's own coronation in 1953.

Rossini composed his 'Little Solemn Mass' in 1863, more than thirty years after he had retired from writing operas, and which Rossini himself described as 'the last of my sins of old age'. In structure a *missa solennis*, the work is scored for the unusual ensemble of four soloists, a small chorus, two pianos and harmonium, and was composed originally for private performance, though Rossini himself later scored the work for full orchestra. It is the most substantial of the works written during Rossini's Indian summer of composition. Neither *petite* nor particularly *solennelle*, despite the religious text the Mass is unmistakably operatic in style, ranging from hushed intensity to boisterous high spirits, and abounding in memorable tunes and rhythmic vitality.

Duke Ellington, one of the jazz greats, was a prolific composer and a deeply religious man. From 1968 to 1973 he wrote and performed a series of 'Sacred Concerts' throughout the USA and Europe, combining jazz, classical, choral, spiritual, gospel, blues and dance music in a joyous celebration of love, life and freedom. Ranging from serious to swinging, and featuring drummers, choirs and big band sounds, the *Sacred Concert* epitomises Duke Ellington's famous quote, 'Every man prays in his own language.' The *Sacred Concert* music is truly unique, a life-enhancing fusion of classical choral music with jazz. We'll be joined by Oldham-born Louise Marshall, whose smouldering voice spans jazz, classical, R&B and gospel genres, and the Cotton Tail Orchestra, led by orchestral and jazz trumpeter Graham South, a mainstay of Manchester's creative music scene.

Neil Taylor is a sought after and renowned choral director, organist, piano accompanist, teacher and coach, based in the North West of England. After winning a Scholarship to the Royal College of Music, he held appointments at St Albans, Norwich, and Sheffield Cathedrals. During his time in Sheffield, the cathedral choir toured both at home and abroad (including Germany, Holland, France, Hungary, the Czech Republic and the USA) and broadcast frequently on BBC Radios 2, 3 & 4. His recordings include *Music for a Millennium*, a Classic FM Magazine Disc of the Year Award Winner, and numerous releases as organist and conductor, all to high critical acclaim. As solo organist, he has played at many of the major venues in the UK, and has worked with the Hallé, Northern Chamber Orchestra, Manchester Camerata, Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra, Royal Northern Sinfonia, the Orchestra of Opera North, Huddersfield Choral Society, and the Orchestra of Welsh National Opera. He is Music Director of St George's Singers, Manchester, and Keele Bach Choir; he appears regularly with the BBC as Musical Director and Organist on *Songs of Praise*, the *BBC Young Chorister of the Year Finals*, the *Daily Service*, and *Sunday Worship*.

Peter Durrant is the accompanist of St George's Singers and Stafford Choral Society and works at the Royal Northern College of Music and Junior RNCM as accompanist. Pete grew up in London, and was a chorister at Westminster Abbey, during which time he toured worldwide and sang at many high-profile events, including the funeral of Princess Diana. In 2004 he moved north to study music at Manchester University, where he learned piano with Tom Scott. He was awarded the Proctor Gregg prize for performance at the end of his second year. In 2010 he completed a Masters in Piano Performance at the Royal Northern College of Music, studying with Jeremy Young and Colin Stone. In the past Pete has played for the Hallé orchestra, been the accompanist of Keele Bach Choir, Manchester University Chorus, has directed and played for Manchester Chamber Choir, and has accompanied the BBCSO Chorus, Sheffield Philharmonic Chorus, Sheffield Chorale, Marple Choral Society, the Hallé, Hallé Youth, Hallé Training and Hallé Children's Choirs. Pete was also the conductor of Leek Choral Society (for whom he wrote his *Requiem* in 2018), the University of Manchester's chamber choir, Ad Solem, as well as Keele Bach Choir in the second half of 2016.

St George's Singers

A passion for singing

The Choir is recognised as one of the most enterprising and innovative choirs in the North of England, with a passion for singing and a commitment to the highest choral standards. The Choir was formed in 1956 at St George's Church, Poynton, and today has around 100 members, travelling from Cheshire, Greater Manchester, Derbyshire and Yorkshire.

Under Musical Director Neil Taylor, the choir performs an extensive and eclectic repertoire that covers renaissance, baroque, classical, modern and jazz works and newly commissioned choral works. We put on four major concerts a year, hold an annual singing day, and are frequently invited to take part in collaborative ventures with other choirs and orchestras. We perform in venues across Greater Manchester, including the Bridgewater Hall, Royal Northern College of Music, The Stoller Hall, Manchester Cathedral and Gorton Monastery, as well as our 'home churches' of St George's in Stockport and Poynton. We have sung with world-class soloists such as Sir Willard White, James Gilchrist, Mark Padmore, Christopher Purves, Kitty Whately, Jacqui Dankworth and Elizabeth Watts. We commission new choral works, have led the BBC Daily Service from Emmanuel Church, Didsbury, appeared on BBC Radio 3's *In Tune*, and tour regularly in the UK and in Europe, recent destinations including Poland, Finland, Estonia, Hungary, Prague, Paris, Belgium, Germany, and in 2017, to celebrate our 60th Anniversary, Costa Rica.

Although a large choir, St George's Singers is an extremely friendly group with a lively musical and social life. We rehearse in Poynton every Tuesday evening at St George's Church Hall, and new members are always welcome. Entry is via audition, and we recommend you come and long to a few rehearsals before auditioning.
