Dear Friends

Our Musical Director Neil Taylor has created a very varied programme for 2009–2010, offering something to appeal to everyone, singers and audience alike.

Our aim of including young people in our music making which we started last season continues in a number of this season's concerts. We return to the Royal Northern College of Music in November for a performance of Will Todd's *Mass in Blue* with the student Jazz Collective. Our previous experience of a jazz concert was in June 2006 when we performed Duke Ellington's *Sacred Concert* at Manchester Cathedral – a very exciting evening for us all. One of the pleasures of singing in a choir is the opportunity to explore different types of music and we look forward to working with the students, and with celebrated soloist, Tina May, for this concert.

Last season started and ended with very different concerts at Gorton Monastery. This year we return to the wonderful setting of the Monastery in March for a performance of Monteverdi's *Vespers*. The work was first performed in 1610 and the Monastery seems to us to be the perfect place to give a 400th anniversary performance of this great work. We are very pleased to be joined once again by students from Chetham's School of Music for this concert. The Chetham's Brass Ensemble made a stunning contribution to our concert at Manchester Cathedral last season and we feel sure that their Baroque Orchestra will be equally impressive. We are also joined by an excellent team of young soloists including Marcus Farnsworth, our previous Assistant Musical Director, who is now studying at the Royal Academy of Music.

As usual our season will include the traditional Christmas concert, which again will feature young readers from local schools, the very popular Singing Day – famous for the quality of the refreshments as well as the vocal training and music-making – and another visit to Emmanuel Church, Didsbury for a live broadcast of the BBC Radio 4 Daily Service. The Choir goes on tour in May and the season then concludes with a concert celebrating the German choral tradition including works by Bach, Brahms and Mendelssohn.

I am sure you will find something of interest in our Season Brochure and on behalf of St George's Singers look forward to welcoming you to our concerts in the year ahead.

2010 Singing Day Dvorák Mass in D

Conductor Neil Taylor Accompanist Jeffrey Makinson

For our 2010 Singing Day, Neil Taylor has chosen a wonderful setting of the Mass by Czech composer, Antonin Dvorák.

Of the three mass settings by Dvorák, only the Mass in D from 1887 survives. One of the most beautiful pieces of choral music, the work was originally written for choir (with small solo parts) and organ, to dedicate a small chapel. However, the spiritual impulse behind the piece is personal tragedy: the loss of two daughters and a son led Dvorák to immerse himself in his work, and the moving Mass in D is one of the results.

If you have not sung this work before, this is a great opportunity to learn and perform it in concert in one day. And if you already know it - then come along anyway, and join us for a great day's singing.

Our Singing Days are extremely popular, so early booking is recommended.

St George's Singers returns once more to The Monastery to perform a work that was destined to be sung in a magnificent building such as this. Monteverdi's Vespro della Beata Vergine 1610 – more commonly known as the Vespers of 1610 – is a monumental work of music, which pulls together psalms, meditations and virtuosic vocal and instrumental solos, and calls for the Choir to split into as many as ten parts, and accompany six different soloists. The work not only presents intimate, prayerful moments but also incorporates secular music in an array of different musical forms.

A wonderful line-up of soloists, and the young musicians of Chetham's School of Music will be joining us for this performance. Saturday 26 June 2010, 7.30 pm St George's Church, Stockport

German Masterworks Choral works by Bach, Mendelssohn and Brahms

Conductor Neil Taylor Organ Jeffrey Makinson

The final concert of the season explores masterworks of German choral music by some of the greatest composers of their (and indeed any) era.

The journey begins naturally with Bach, the father of German music, and with two of his sacred motets, *Jesu meine Freude* and *Lobet den Herrn*. Mendelssohn, whose choral music owes a tremendous debt to Bach, is represented by his 8-part setting of Psalm 43 (*Richte mich Gott*) and his popular *Hear my Prayer*. He forges a wonderful link between the late baroque of Bach and the high romanticism of Brahms, whose *Three Festival Anthems* and *Geistliches Lied* will be among some of the other choral classics sung by the Choir. Our Accompanist Jeffrey Makinson will also be performing some of the virtuoso organ works from these three giants of music.
