

Neil Taylor is an experienced choral conductor and musical director as well as an acclaimed organist. A former chorister of Bradford Cathedral Neil won a scholarship to the RCM in 1986. He was Organ Scholar at St Albans Cathedral and Assistant Organist at Norwich Cathedral before taking up the post of Organist and Master of the Music at Sheffield Cathedral in 1997. Neil joined St George's Singers as Musical Director in September 2006. Neil has directed and assisted at choral courses in Aldeburgh, Austria, Italy and Mexico, as well as the famous Eton Choral Courses, and is also Artistic Director of the Sheffield Cathedral Arts Festival.

Antonin Dvořák was born in a Bohemian village near Prague in 1841and followed Smetana as the leading exponent of Czech musical nationalism. After working as a violinist under Smetana, with encouragement from Brahms, Dvořák devoted the major part of his life to composition.

The *Mass in D*, written in 1887, is the only surviving of Dvořák's three mass settings. One of the most beautiful pieces of choral music, the work was originally written for choir (with small solo parts) and organ, to dedicate a small chapel. However, the spiritual impulse behind the piece is personal tragedy: the loss of two daughters and a son led Dvořák to immerse himself in his work, and the moving *Mass in D* is one of the results.
